This is an account from the Flight Log of USMC Dive-Bomber pilot, Lt. H.E. Bradshaw

Attached to **VMSB 243**, known as "**The Flying Goldbricks**", in WWII, participating in "The Battle for Bougainville Island" and "Battle for Rabaul". It is sometimes referenced as "The Hyper War", in the Solomon Islands and Archipelago Areas. During two campaigns in 1943 and 1944, Lt. Bradshaw was awarded The Air Medal and two Gold Stars (in lieu of second and third Air Medals) for his aerial achievements. Dive Bomber – Douglas Dauntless SBD-5—referred to as "Slow But Deadly"

Began training in Jan 1943 in Pensacola and arrived in Munda, New Georgia Island in Nov 1943.

Nov 43 Strikes—Kara & Kahili, Bougainville Island & Empress Augusta

Dec43 Nine Strikes—Bougainville and Ballale Islands, flies to Efate, New Hebrides.

Mar44 S.C.A.T. missions--from Efate to Espiritu Santos to Guadalcanal to Sterling Is. to Green Island.

Mar44 Strikes in Kaviang & Keravia Bay (w/ tailgunner "Sullivan")

Apr44 Strikes Keravia Bay, Talili Bay

Jun44 Strikes on Rapapo (at this point—Lt. Bradshaw has recorded 24 Combat strikes & 31 Combat missions)

Jul44 Strikes on Rabaul, New Ireland, and Mane Island (Tailgunner "Sullivan") (32 Combat Strikes, 47 Combat Missions to date)

Aug44 Strikes on Rabaul, New Britain, Hospital Ridge, Tobera, New Ireland, and Libba Plantation (41 Combat Strikes, 63 Combat Missions)

Sep44 Strikes on New Ireland & Mane Island targets

Oct44 Participated in N.A.T.S. missions—travelled to California.

** McDonnell Douglas lost the contract to produce the Dive Bombers to Curtiss Wright. Lt. Bradshaw Returned to the states to train on the new "Helldiver SB2C", known as "The Beast" and "Son of a Bitch 2nd Class". It was known to be somewhat unstable in dives and difficult to fly. He trained from Jan45 to May45. He was re-assigned to VMSB 244, "The Bombing Banshees", and returned to Combat in "The Liberation of the Phillipines", in a USMC operation "Magzam". Dive Bomber "Helldiver SB2C-4"

Jun45 Arrived in Samar—new Tailgunner "McKenna"

Jul45 Strikes on – Tupi, Waloe, Lamonai, & Tamogan—travelled to Malabang

Aug45 Strikes on Waloe & division tactics

Sep45 flew from Malabang to Samar to Mindoro, Luzon, to Okinawa

Oct45 flew to Tsingtau, China to Okinawa

Nov45 Patrols Tsingtau to Chinan Railway, Shanghai to Manilla, Manilla to Zamboango to Pelilu to Guam, to Eniwetok.

Dec45 Travelled to Ewa, and finally, to the states.

Lt. Bradshaw was awarded "The Distinguished Flying Cross" for his combat missions, serving VMSB 243 & VMSB 244 in the Solomon Islands & the Phillipines. He was promoted to the rank of Major, while serving in the Reserves.

Lt. Bradshaw was from Lenoir, NC and a machinist by trade. He passed away in 1979 from complications related to an auto accident. The above information was provided by his proud son, Mark Bradshaw.
